

Heart Math Tutoring Kicks Off Annual Volunteer Recruitment Campaign

HMT needs approximately 1,500 tutors to help 1,300 students in CMS schools



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Heart Math Tutoring is looking for [volunteer](http://heartmathtutoring.org/volunteers/become-a-volunteer/#volunteer) tutors (<http://heartmathtutoring.org/volunteers/become-a-volunteer/#volunteer>) to support over 1,300 students in the 2022/23 school year. Did you know that in 2021, only 38% of fourth graders in Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools performed on grade level in math? This represented a 25% decline from 2019 scores.¹ A recent study published jointly by the Annenberg Institute at Brown University and the University of Virginia cites principles for effective tutoring, such as high-quality curriculum, measurement, small group size, and consistent relationships, that align with HMT's core model.²

[Heart Math Tutoring](http://heartmathtutoring.org/) (HMT, Heart) (<http://heartmathtutoring.org/>) – a local nonprofit organization committed to helping students in CMS elementary schools develop a strong foundation in math and enthusiasm for academics – is kicking off its annual volunteer recruitment campaign for the 2022/23 school year. HMT's goal is to serve 1,300 students by recruiting approximately 1,500 volunteer tutors between now and mid-September.

As a volunteer tutor with Heart Math Tutoring, your addition makes a difference! In 2021/22, 97% of 930 Heart Math Tutoring students met program growth goals in math. 98% of Heart volunteers rated the experience positive, and 95% of tutors reported they saw improvement in their students' confidence and enthusiasm for learning on a year-end survey.

Volunteering with Heart Math Tutoring is Simple

Heart Math Tutoring volunteers commit to weekly tutoring sessions that last either 30 minutes or one hour. Heart is offering its core, in-person model in 18 schools across the district, and we hope that our Charlotte-based tutors will sign up to volunteer in-person. Our virtual model will be offered in 8 schools and is a great fit for those who live outside of Charlotte or whose schedules involve heavy travel. Math does not have to be a strong subject for volunteers because HMT provides training and a structured elementary-level curriculum that features hands-on activities and math games. If you can count, you can be a tutor! A staff member is always available during tutoring sessions to make sure tutors have what they need.
